Dear Colleagues,

It is with great pleasure that Iceland welcomes you to the 12th annual meeting of the European Heritage Heads Forum. The event will take place from 7 to 9 June 2017 in the Harpa cultural centre in the heart of Reykjavík.

Harpa, designed by Henning Larsen Architects and Batteríið Architects with Icelandic-Danish artist Ólafur Elíasson, has won multiple awards for architecture including Mies van der Rohe in 2013, Best public space – Arkitekturmassan Awards 2012, and the World Architecture Award 2010.

On 9 February 2017, representatives of the Council of Europe and the European Parliament reached a provisional agreement on a decision establishing the European Year of Cultural Heritage 2018. At the meeting in Reykjavík we will focus on two of the main objectives of the European Year of Cultural Heritage. We will thus discuss the promotion of cultural diversity, intercultural dialogue and social cohesion as well as the highlighting of the economic contribution of the cultural heritage to local and regional development. We want to hear what young people have to say about our cultural diversity and the importance of cultural heritage to society. As we all know, recent research has revealed how much the cultural heritage contributes to the society - a truth which is not universally accepted. It is thus important that we discuss the different aspects of economic issues of our cultural heritage in relation to developing and planning. We will be discussing these themes further within our discussion groups.

On the Friday afternoon we offer an excursion to selected places in southwest Iceland, where we will see archaeology and traditional buildings, and enjoy the spectacles of volcanoes, glaciers and waterfall, ending the day with a dinner before coming back to Reykjavík.
