

The Family of Man, the famous exhibition curated by the photographer and painter Edward J. Steichen who was born in Luxembourg, has been labeled by UNESCO as part of the Memories of the World register. The collection is made up of 503 photographs by 273 artists, from 68 countries, brought together by Edward Steichen for the New York Museum of Modern Art (MoMA). Presented for the first time in 1955, the exhibition was meant as a manifesto for peace and the fundamental equality of mankind via the humanist photography of the postwar years. Images by artists such as Robert Capa, Henri Cartier-Bresson, Dorothea Lange, Robert Doisneau, August Sander and Ansel Adams were staged in a modernist and spectacular manner. Having toured the globe, exhibited in over 150 museums worldwide, a final integral version of the exhibition was permanently installed in Clervaux Castle in 1994. Between 2011–2014 the Service des sites et monuments nationaux entirely refitted the exhibition.
