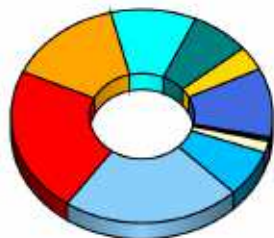


Priority Sector: Cultural heritage

By 30 April 2009, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway have approved 1197 projects, programmes and funds amounting to €1168 million in grants.

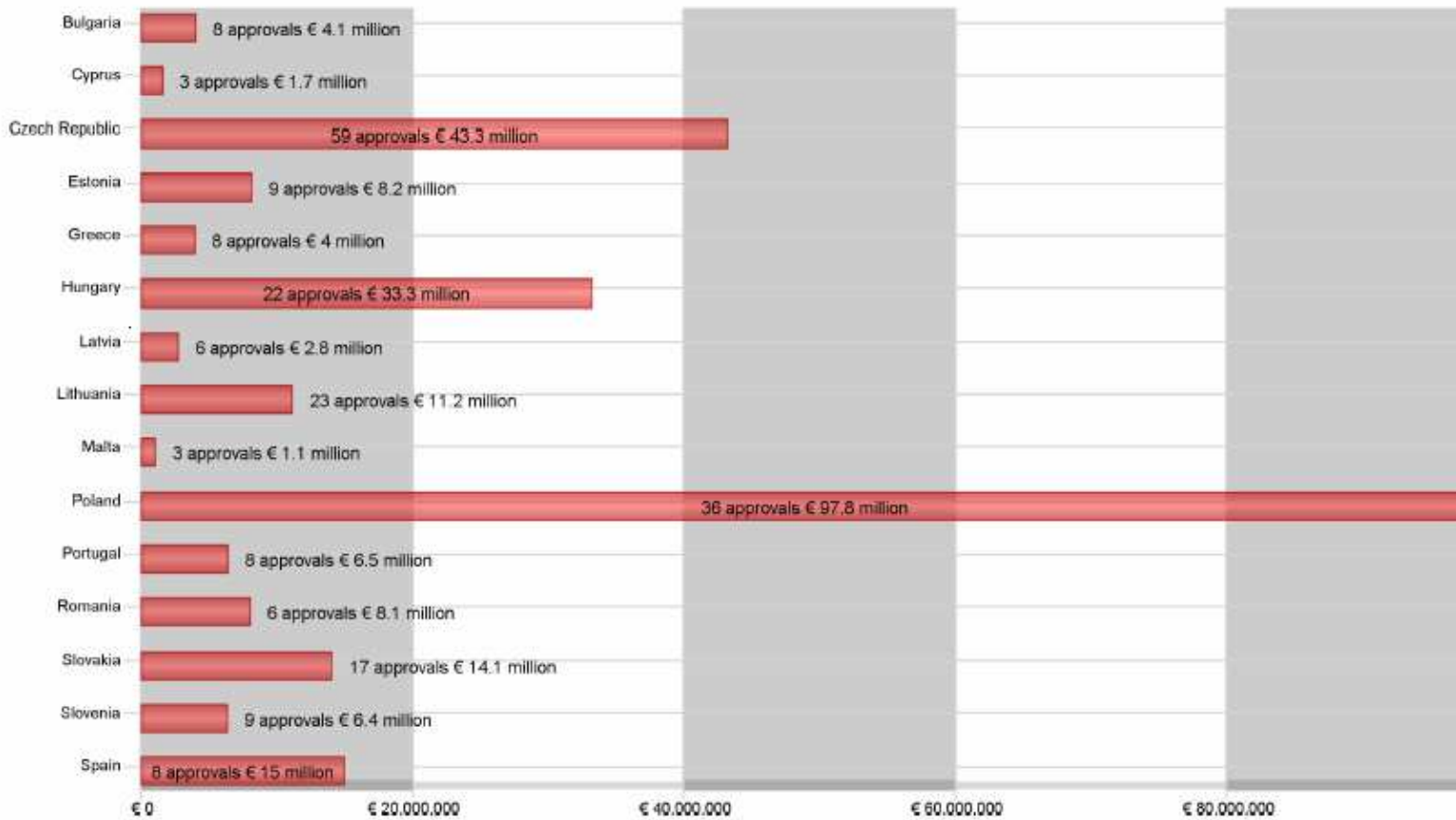
The supported activities include 225 health and childcare projects, amounting to € 258 million in grants - equaling 22% of all approved grants.

Breakdown of approved cultural heritage projects and funds by Beneficiary States

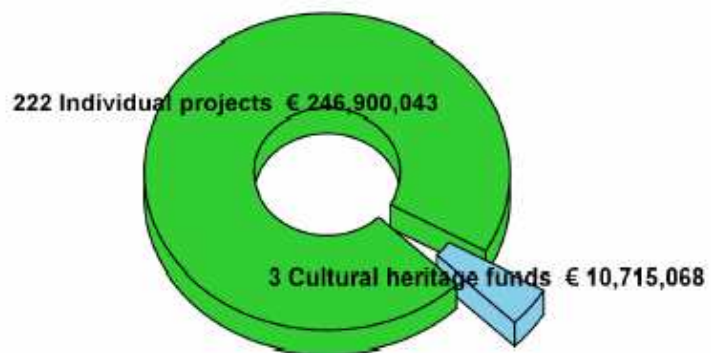

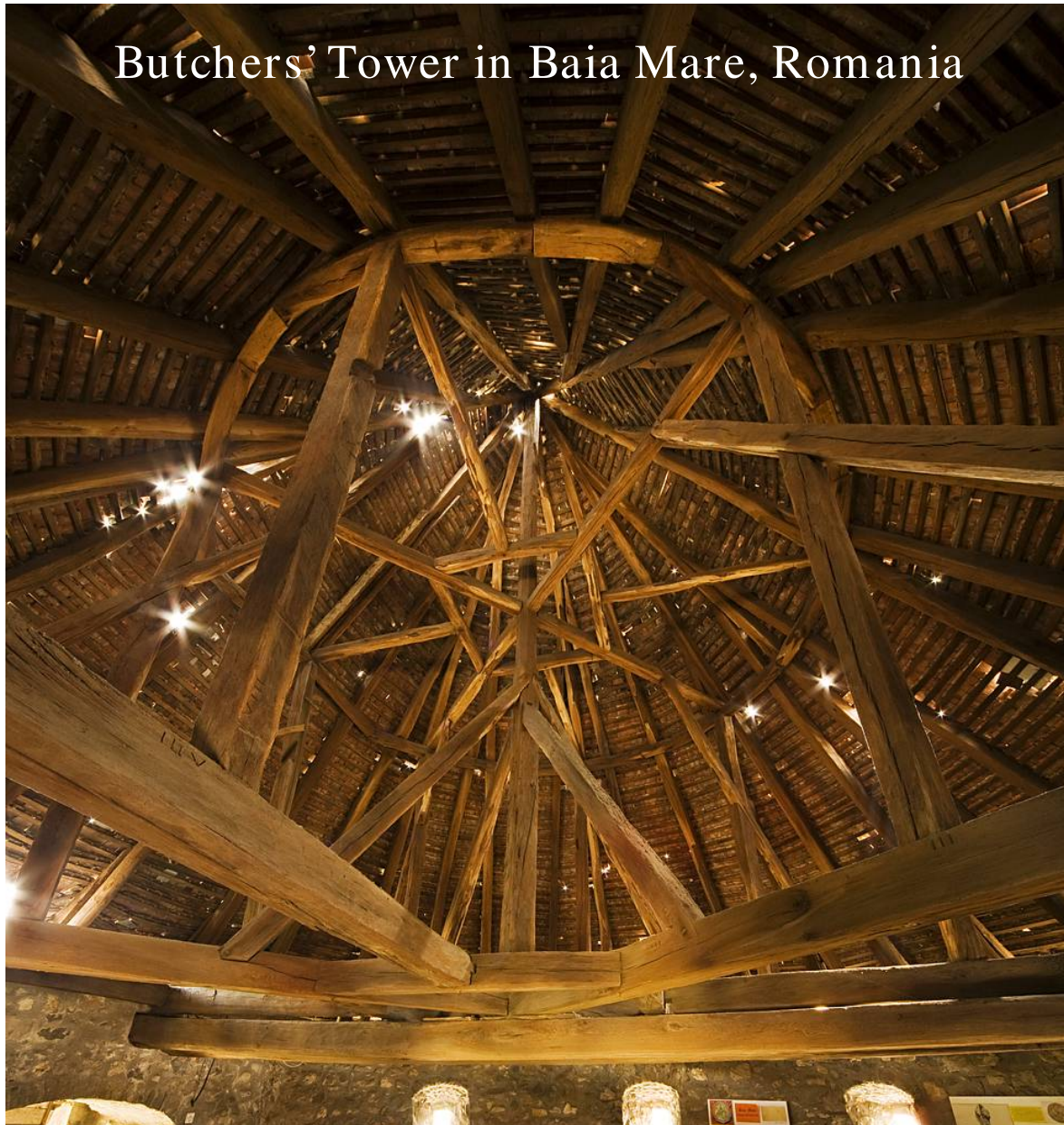

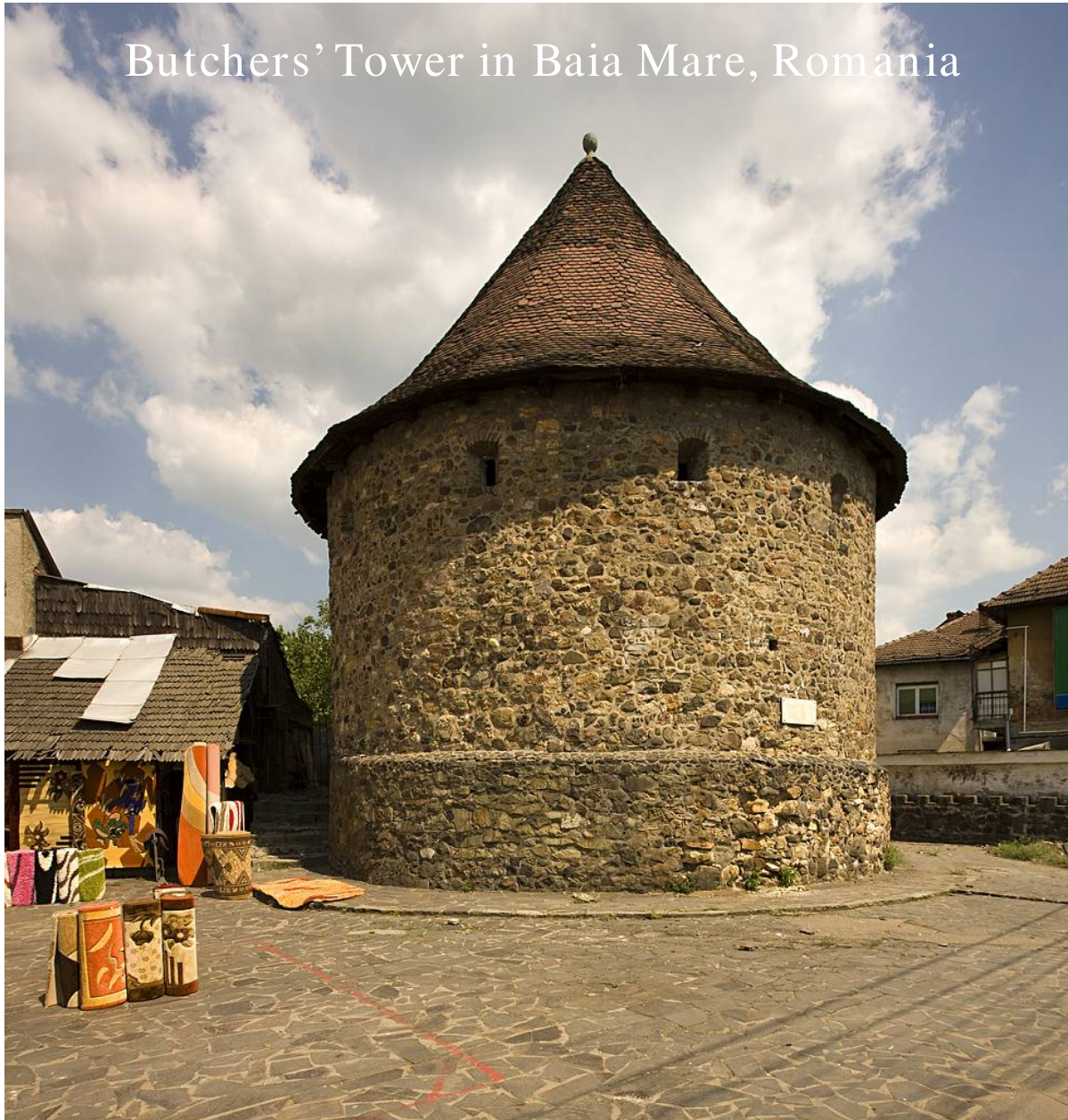

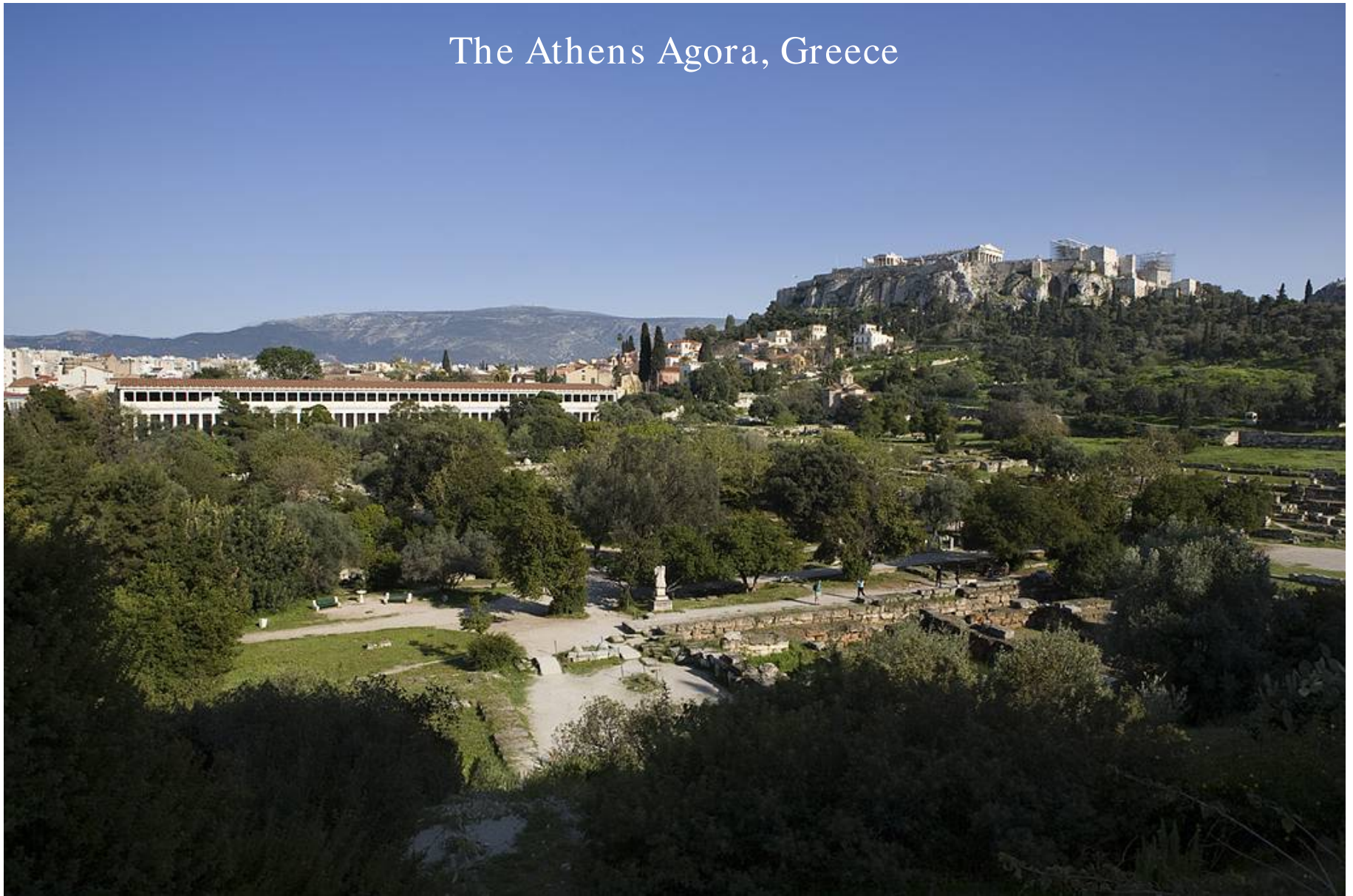
