Core tasks:

- to ensure that <u>relevant information on the development and consequences</u>
 <u>of proposed legislation</u> developed by the European Union which may pose a
 potential threat to cultural heritage <u>is circulated in a timely manner to the</u>
 <u>national competent authorities!</u>
- to function in an expert advisory capacity
- to formulate "core scripts" (invaluable documents for cross-governmental work which may be freely used by each Member State) where feasible and provide warnings to the EHHF secretariat for the purpose of communication. It brings the inputs of several members into one consolidated draft. The "core script" does not bear any official character and its only purpose is to coordinate and foster joint action across Europe.



Need to improve:

- The EHLF, as the Standing Committee of the EHHF, is a platform for cooperation and consultations.
- What "is relevant" for each member will differ from case to case and between the Member States.
- A "filtering-action" is required at national level to ascertain if the (planned) regulative actions of the EU Commission will have consequences and to decide on a course of action.
- The EHLF has experienced that early and informed action greatly increases the chance to influence the work of the EU Commission effectively.
- Therefore, the privileged communication with the DG EAC (EU-Commission), allows for possible influence also during Commission Inter Service Consultations.



Need to improve:

- For the EHLF to function each delegated member has the obligation to check the EU-legal activities. It is their task to fulfill the "watchdog" role and make the relevant national conclusions.
- Improve the description and specification for the members delegated to the EHLF to give a clearer picture of their tasks and duties as national responsible Members of the EHLF.
- All Member States have different laws and have to decide by themselves if it is in their interest to check and to develop an opinion about what mainly the EU Commission is still planning.
- Offer some assistance to your EHLF-Member in this so-called "filteringaction".
- Improve the production of consolidation, summarising the inputs of several Members into one "core script" and ensure that the EHHF Secretatriat then will be able to communicate this to all EHHF-Members.

 - ➤ State Aid Modernisation: The Commission has adopted the revised General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER) in July 2014 which includes "Aid for culture and heritage conservation" as a new category of exempted state aid (Fine!)
 - Figure State Aid Modernisation: EU law manifests the fact that "Aid for culture and heritage conservation" is not categorically excluded from the notion of State aid despite Article 107(3) (d) TFEU "The following may be considered to be compatible with the internal market: aid to promote culture and heritage conservation where such aid does not affect trading conditions and competition in the Union to an extent that is contrary to the common interest". The notion of State aid is extensive because it does not only cover de iure but also de facto economic activities. Consequently, aid measures for cultural heritage will still have to be addressed with care.

 - The European standardisation system: European standards are being formulated in the Cultural Heritage sector with CEN/TC 346 Conservation of Cultural Heritage since 2004. The main objective of CEN/TC 346 is to develop, on a need-based approach, specific normative documents in the field of conservation of cultural heritage. We would like to emphasize in particular the project European Norm (prEN) 16883 "Guidelines for improving the energy performance of historic buildings" from April 21st, 2015, which is now in the CEN Enquiry. There is a need for the Heads of the competent authorities to engage more actively with the CEN-, esp. the CEN/ TC 346 work and use this mechanism to their benefit!



- Scrutinisation of the new European Commission's Roadmap 2015:
 - This work programme seems to differ from those of the previous EU-Commissions (http://ec.europa.eu/priorities/work-programme/index_en.htm). The impression is that the new EU-Commission wishes to concentrate on new efforts which will have a positive effect on jobs, growth and investment in 2015. New Initiatives will be formulated:
 - **❖ €** 315 billion Investment Offensive
 - An ambitious Digital Single Market package
 - Creating a European Energy Union
 - **❖** A New Policy on Migration
 - **❖** A Fair Taxation Environment



- Scrutinisation of the new European Commission's Roadmap 2015:
 - Further, in 79 areas the Commission will take action to ensure existing EU legislation is fit for purpose (so-called "Cutting red-tape"), including:
 - Simplification measures to reduce regulatory burden
 - Repeals of legislation no longer needed
 - Evaluations and fitness checks to assess the added value of EU legislation
 - ❖ One important example: The Evaluation of Directive 2007/2/EC establishing an Infrastructure for Spatial Information in the European Community (INSPIRE), which touches the architectural Cultural Heritage as well as the archaeological sites.

- Scrutinisation of the new European Commission's Roadmap 2015:
 - Then, the EU-Commission suggests the elimination of 80 pending legislative proposals for 3 main reasons:
 - Don't match the political priorities of the EU Commission, f. e.
 - Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement (ACTA)
 - Regulation on ground handling services at Union airports
 - ❖ Have been sitting on a negotiation table for too long, f. e.
 - Financing of Nuclear Power Stations
 - Directive on passenger car related taxes
 - Won't deliver the results that we need in their current form ("Clearing the decks"), f.
 e.
 - Circular Economy Package
 - Energy Taxation Directive
