INTRODUCTION

Throughout Europe there is a range of cultures influencing the sense of identity and memory.

Nevertheless there are issues common to all countries, but the priorities and responses to those issues will differ from state to state.

The cultural heritage in Europe both poses and faces major challenges.

This is driven by some powerful forces:

- Globalisation
- Democratisation
- Migration
- European unity

Our concept of what constitutes heritage continues to evolve in response to social and intellectual development and this impacts on the way we work. These new concepts require new kinds of communication within and beyond the heritage community. This also requires the development of heritage experts able to draw on a wide range of skills and communicate widely to all sections of society.

- Develop as a specific publication from the European Heritage Forum an analysis of the economic and social benefits of investment in the historic environment, including sustainable tourism

The forum should meet annually hosted by a different member organisation.

The forum should establish a secretariat, to be provided by a member organisation for a three-year period, to ensure continuing communication.
