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The 2003 Convention in Finland

- Finnish Heritage Agency responsible for the implementation since 2013
- a full-time coordinator (senior adviser) since 2014
- Extensive network among actors in all of the ICH fields among NGOs, museums and other institutions (Circles of Living Heritage)
- Numerous seminars, webinars, workshops, events every year
- A lot media attention through the years, especially on inventorying and UNESCO inscriptions (Sauna culture, Kaustinen fiddle playing, Nordic Clinkerboat traditions)







Bottom-up safeguarding with the Wiki-inventory for Living Heritage

- MediaWiki with so far 240 examples from over 400 communities around the country in six languages
- 100 000 visits from 150 countries in 2022
- 1-2 page texts, gateway to other information
- Map: regions and municipalities
- Communities produce and are responsible for the content, the Agency moderating
- Constantly evolving platform
